Cllr J England - PA/2021/727 – declared a personal & prejudicial interest as known to the applicant. Cllr T Foster – PA/2021/727 – declared a personal & prejudicial interest as known to the applicant. Cllr N Poole - PA/2021/727 – declared a personal interest as resident on the same road as proposal.

29. Planning

To receive planning applications from NLC and resolve a response

Cllr T Foster & Cllr J England both left the room prior to discussion of the following item.

a) PA/2021/727 – G Parkes, Hop Villa, 6 Well Street – to erect 3 dwellings, re-submission of PA/2021/96.

Resolved: To OBJECT for the same reasons as the previously submitted application PA/2021/96;

- A three story development would change the street scene in one of the oldest parts of the village.
- There are no three story properties in Messingham, allowing the proposal would urbanise and change the character of the village.
- The height and close proximity to neighboring properties on the south, east and west of the proposal will result in their loss of amenity.
- The proposal would be over development of the site.
- The increase in vehicles and traffic on the narrowest part of the road only 3.5 metres wide would impact on neighbouring properties.
- Concerns of pedestrian safety due to the length of proposed drop kerb in this narrowest part of the road.

Cllr T Foster & Cllr J England returned to the meeting

b) PA/2021/999 – C Allen & T Binks, former site of Priesthows, Butterwick Road – to erect 6 holiday lodges, re-submission of PA/2020/1251.

Resolved: Object for the same reasons as the previously submitted application PA/2020/1251;

- The proposed location is too close proximity to the village and allotment site.
- The allotments provide a valued amenity space and should not be impacted on by holiday or residential properties.
- The visual impact is detrimental to the street scene and the entrance to the village.
